Guest Speaker – Prof. Robert Park

Professor Robert Park is our March speaker. His



highly interesting subject is the discovery of Sir John Franklin's long- lost ships in the Canadian high artic. The Franklin expedition, in search of the North-West passage, left England in 1854 and was never

seen again. Over the years, countless searches have been made without success.

Professor Park is an archaeological anthropologist who has extensively researched the Inuit's way of life. In the process, he became involved in the search for Franklin's ships over ten years ago in 2008. His first-hand involvement in the discovery is a fascinating story.

Professor Park is Associate Dean, Infrastructure and Technology and Acting Chair of Anthropology at the University of Waterloo.




Ticket sales for the upcoming Shaw Festival
