

# Probus Inter-Club Golf Tournament Cancelled



When we resume our meetings, we will have the pleasure of greeting 6 new talented members!



### **Getting to know your Management Team**

#### Mike Hoshooley

After growing up in Scarboro Ontario and completing high school in 1961, I joined the Bank of Montreal. Following several branch assignments in Ontario I spent 8 years in Head Office in Montreal until 1976 when it was



effectively moved to Toronto where I spent another 13 years in various HQ functions. I then moved out of HQ and rejoined the banking world and was a commercial account manager in Hamilton Ontario until 1995 when I took early retirement. I did something completely different for 6 years, driving a school bus here in Halton region, which was a most enjoyable experience. In 2004 Bank of Montreal called me and offered me a short-term contract position which lasted 7 years mostly working at home and from which I retired finally in 2011.

I married my wife, Ruth, in 1966 and our two children were born in 1971 and 1976, both in Quebec. My wife Ruth and I were very active in the Multiple Sclerosis Society and I was a member of the Optimist Club of Oakville for 25 years until 2009, when I was invited to join the Lakeshore Probus Club by Ray Everett. After a couple of years, I was honoured to be the Club's Vice president, then President in 2012/13 and afterwards continued with the management of the club as treasurer for 3 years. In 2017 I was part of the team with representatives of other Probus Clubs to establish a Mixed Probus Club in Burlington, of which my wife and I are members, and which has grown to be a very successful member of the Probus Club society. I served again as treasurer of our Lakeshore Mens' Club in 2017/18 and have had the pleasure of continuing to serve the club as one of two vice presidents in 2019/20.

Most of you are familiar with Events Committee from our presentations in Hi-Lites and at monthly meetings. What do we do to bring these events to fruition? Here's an example from a year in which a viral pandemic does <u>not</u> occur.



Our work starts in November when Theatre Companies announce their productions for the following year. The committee decides which shows to offer and how many seats to book. When our order is confirmed, we set a ticket price and open sales at monthly meetings. When our final payment is received, we are sent the tickets which are distributed to members.

Other events, such as our recent Grand River Cruise, are less complex but follow the same general procedure. Handling as many as four events at a time is a demanding task; and committee members Bob Moulton, Dick Moskal, Mike Ciocci and Michael Hill work hard on your behalf to ensure things go smoothly.

On a personal note, I was born in Victoria, BC and raised by my mother and grandmother after my father was killed in action in Italy in 1944. After obtaining an honours physics degree at UBC, I took a Masters Degree in Nuclear Physics at McMaster. This in turn led to a 35-year career as a science teacher which included a two-and-a-half-year secondment to TVOntario in the 1980s.

After retiring I did private tutoring and spent time on the City's Sustainable Development and Citizen Involvement Committees and then with the Roseland Community Organization where I chaired its Tree Preservation Committee.
