To paraphrase Robert Burns: "The Best Laid Plans of mice and events committees gang aft agley" After a very successful 2019 season, with three theatre events, a Grand River cruise and visit to the Twenty Creek distillery, all well attended and enjoyed, we began our 2020 planning with expectations of doing as well or perhaps better.

At first things went well; three theatre events were booked at the Shaw and Stratford festivals, and, new for us, the Lighthouse Theatre in Port Dover. Ticket sales were very positive and we began arrangements for several smaller outings - a tour of the Weather Channel studios and a multi-generational trip to a Bulldogs hockey game.

Then, in mid-March came the COVID-19 lockdown, with groups limited to small size, (as low as 2 at one point, which didn't allow any of our events) and the word "Zoom" began turning up everywhere.

So we began the process of cancelling our bookings (only the three theatre events had been finalized) and getting refunds for those who had purchased tickets.

This was harder than it looked as the theatres were required to close their box office. However we persevered and succeeded in obtaining full refunds for all events, which were distributed to members as appropriate. To paraphrase the Bard "much ado, with nothing to show for it".

So we look to 2021. The ultimate principle of physics applies here; "when you investigate the unknown you do not know what you will find". But we **will** find things to offer - smaller perhaps, within modest distance, perhaps outdoors, and with smaller numbers of participants.

Richard Moskal is retiring from the committee, and will be greatly missed, but there will be three experienced and two new members to carry on. Any thoughts/ideas you might have of an event that would meet our general criteria. would be appreciated. We'll do the follow-up and make arrangements as needed.


