Jim Thurston's Presidential Message

Congratulations are in order for our Past President, Bill Willson. He successfully ran and was elected as District #3's representative on the National PROBUS Board of Directors. District #3 has 28 clubs and covers an area from Scarborough to Burlington. Bill will serve for 3 years and replaces Bob Boone who has completed six years on the board. John Morgan of Cooksville ran a good campaign, but against Bill's experience on numerous not-for-profit boards, including the Royal Botanical Gardens, Hamilton Philharmonic Orchestra, Burlington Community Foundation, Hamilton and District CA Association, Burlington Chamber of Commerce and Mozart Chamber Orchestra of Burlington, was not successful. Using Bill's work on the Management Committee of Lakeshore PROBUS as an example, I know we will be well served at National.

I had an opportunity in March to hike the Burlington Beach Strip and out to the Pier and Lighthouse. It provides a great opportunity to get fresh air and exercise. The day I was out was very cold so there were fewer walkers than normal and it felt like I had the beach to myself. If you have not had the opportunity to hike to the pier you may wish to do so this spring. There is talk the Federal Government may be closing it to residents, because of safety concerns. If you have the chance to lobby all branches of Government, including our own Burlington Counsellors, please do so. It would be a shame to let this "very Burlington icon" be shut down because of safety concerns. How many people have we lost on the canal piers?

Our March speaker, Dr. Paul Evans, held us spellbound for over an hour describing China and its march to dominance. Following his talk, the Speaker's Committee received a number of messages from our members expressing their enthusiasm.

Guest Speaker - Marvin Ryder



Marvin Ryder is Associate Professor of marketing and entrepreneurship at the DeGroote School of Business, McMaster University. He has taught for 35 years and has mentored 10,000 graduate and undergraduate students. He has written sixty case studies illustrating marketing, entrepreneurship, and business strategy problems with companies like Porsche, Union Gas, Crayola and Molson Breweries.

In Hanilton, Marvin served on the Board of Directors for Copps Coliseum, Hamilton Place and the Hamilton Convention Centre from 1990 to 1996. He was the CHair of the Transition Board that recreated the new City of Hamilton in 2000. Marvin was Chair of the Hamilton Health Sciences Board of Directors for almost three years and retired from the Board in 2010 after nine years of service. He has also served on the Boards of the Bay Area Health Trust, Desjardins Credit Unions, and is currently the Chair of the Hamilton Health Sciences Research Institute.

Today, Marvin is most recognized for newaly 400 appearances annually on CBC, CTV, Global, CHCH-TV, CHML 900AM, CKTB 610AM and other regional broadcasters commenting on the political and business iss of the day.

Lighthouse Festival News


