Janet is an active member in the Hamilton legal community. She was president of the Hamilton Lawyers' Club, Chair and current member of the Lawyers' Legacy for Children. She's presented at various conferences including the National Missing & Exploited Children Training Conference and the Ontario Women in Law Enforcement.

In her spare time, Janet enjoys travelling(COVID permitting!) and staying active with running and biking. She ran numerous marathons including the Boston Marathon twice.
