From the House

Several items from the House this month: Our March 14 meeting will be our first in person meeting at the Art Gallery in over two years. As we return to in person meetings, there are some protocols we'll need to follow. The Gallery will not open until 9:30 a.m. The parking lot doors will be the only access to the building. Upon entering the building you'll need to wear your mask. If possible, an upgraded N95 mask would be ideal, although other masks will be acceptable. The Gallery staff will not be screening members as per the Province's recent lifting of the screening requirement. We will also not be keeping a contact tracing list. In the Shoreline Room where we meet, chairs will be safely spaced. Please choose a chair and that will be your chair for the entire meeting. With the new AV system, it won't matter where you sit, you'll be able to hear and see everything. There will be several sanitization bottles around the room for your convenience.

For members who won't be attending the meeting, you will be able to participate via Zoom in the same manner you have in the past. Be watching for your Zoom invitation.

If you purchased a parking pass in 2020 and still have it, the Gallery will honour it for the remainder of this year. If you wish to buy a parking pass for 2022, they will be on sale at the gallery's front desk. For the benefit of our new members metered parking is available in the City lot behind the AGB, the rate is \$1.75 an hour, coins and cards accepted.

We will have Greeters at the door to welcome you. We ask that you refrain from shaking hands or fist bumping. A friendly smile and verbal greeting will do just fine. We know old habits are hard to break.

As in the past, coffee will be available, supplied by the Gallery's catering service for \$2.00 per cup. Exact change would be appreciated. Members who choose to have a cup may remove their mask. The Gallery has asked that you be seated in your chair while drinking your coffee. Once you've finished your coffee put your mask back on.

We will also be running our popular 50/50 ticket draw. Tickets will be \$1.00 for one ticket, \$2.00 for three tickets and \$5.00 for 8 tickets. Again, exact change if possible.

From experience, we know any/all of these protocols can change with little advance warning. We'll keep you informed of any changes as soon as we hear of them.
