Belfast and Cardiff and for the waterfronts of Toronto, Singapore, Sydney, Cork, London and Governors Island in New York City. He has prepared campus master plans for the University of Manchester and Waterloo, Queen's and Western in Canada and is now planning the new hub for Toronto Pearson International Airport. Joe teaches at the University of Toronto. He writes regularly for the *Globe and Mail* and his book '*Perfect City*' was published by Sutherland House in April 2019.

Joe will be making his presentation in person at the AGB and will be available following the meeting to do a book signing.
