They are offering a GUIDED GROUP TOUR including access to "The Tunnel" which arrives 180 feet down at the base of Niagara Falls.

We need at least 20 people to qualify for the guided tour at a discounted rate of \$41.00 per person. Parking is available close by at \$10 per hour.

#### We are visiting the Poor House on June 23<sup>rd</sup>!

When people hear the term Poor House or Work House, they think of Dickens' London and Oliver Twist, clutching his bowl, asking "Please, Sir. May I have some more?"

But Poor Houses existed in Ontario, and near Fergus Ontario is one of the last standing Houses of Industry in Canada. It was built in 1877 as a "Poor House" or place of refuge for the poor, homeless, and destitute people in Wellington County.

Today, the building is a museum showing the lives of the people who inhabited the house. And on **Thursday, June 23rd at 10:00 am**, Probus Burlington Lakeshore will be there to learn about a little known
