Malcolm Ramsay's Presidential Message

What an extraordinary story we listened to on July 7th as John Boyko shared with us material from his book "The Devil's Trick: How Canada fought the Vietnam War". We all lived through that era, and I venture to say that other than the stories about draft dodgers arriving in Canada most of us were unaware of any involvement by our Government in that conflict.

Through the lens of six remarkable people, some well-known, others obscure, John Boyko recounted Canada' often-overlooked involvement in that conflict as peacemaker, combatant, and provider of weapons and sanctuary. To name just two, Brigadier General Sherwood Lett arrived in Vietnam over a decade before American troops, he and the Canadians under his command risked their lives trying to enforce an unstable peace while questioning whether they were merely handmaidens to a new war. As American battleships steamed across the Pacific, Canadian diplomat Blair Seaborn was meeting secretly in Hanoi with North Vietnam's prime minister; if American leaders accepted his roadmap to peace, those ships could be turned around before war began.

I recommend his book The Devil's Trick: How Canada Fought the Vietnam War. published by Knopf Penguin Random House in Canada and available in your favourite bookstore. You might also be interested in visiting his web site, <u>https://johnboyko.com/</u>
