However, once misinformation and 'fake news' becomes accepted as factual, it feeds on confirmation bias

and becomes entrenched in the minds of people who want to believe it to be true. In order to live in free and just societies, all information is open to criticism and scrutiny without exception. And so it's time to make facts and Critical Thinking sexy again.

The biggest take away from this talk is that if people use Critical Thinking skills *fairly*, they will be more empowered to have meaningful discussions about important issues, disagree entirely, and still be able to get along. Learning these skills will allow us to value discourse over hatred, dialogue over violence, and most importantly, fairness and understanding in our disagreements on important issues. And in today's *Age of Immediacy* where information and opinions are just a click away, there seems to be less and less time in which to practice such skills.

Through the fair use of Critical Thinking skills, we can look to the future with the hope that civil and political discourse will regain its rightful place in the marketplace of ideas and we can once again acknowledge and appreciate the importance of truth and facts which will hopefully make conversations great again.
