Guest Speaker: Rob Godwin

Robert Godwin and his work have been featured on BBC, CNN, CBS, CBC, and the Discovery, History and Smithsonian Channels along with numerous radio stations and podcasts. He has served as Space Curator at the Canadian Air & Space Museum. His 2015 book on "William"



Leitch" is responsible for rewriting the early history of rocketry.

He is a lifetime member of both the National Space Society and the Space Frontier Foundation and a committee member of both the International Astronomical Academy and American Astronomical Society. He has staged space exhibitions in the USA and Canada and has spoken at countless venues including the Canadian Embassy in Washington.

All of Robert's work has appeared in his award-winning books "The NASA Mission Reports" which has sold in excess of 250,000 copies - far beyond best seller status in the world of non-fiction. Contributors to the books included Apollo astronauts Buzz Aldrin, Neil Armstrong, Jim Lovell along with numerous other space pioneers.

Robert even has the honour of having a main belt asteroid named after him "4252 Godwin" by the International Astronomical Union for his efforts in documenting space history and raising awareness about Near Earth Objects. It is located between the orbits of Mars and Jupiter.
