Guest Speaker - Jeffrey R Manishen



Jeffrey Manishen graduated from Osgoode Hall Law School, was called to the Ontario Bar in 1977 and is a senior counsel in the law firm of Ross & McBride LLP. He practices criminal law on a full-time basis in Hamilton, Ontario. He was an Assistant Crown Attorney in Hamilton from 1977 to 1985. He has been certified by the Law Society of Upper Canada as a Specialist in Criminal Law since 1989. He has been recognized for his practice in criminal law by The Best Lawyers in Canada since 2006. He was recognized by his peers with the Ed Orzel Award for Excellence in Trial Advocacy, Hamilton Law Association, 2010. In 2016, he was inducted into the International Academy of Trial Lawyers.

He has lectured and instructed on substantive criminal law, the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, trial advocacy, expert evidence and police training for the Law Society of Ontario, the Criminal Lawyers' Association of Ontario, the Ontario Crown Attorneys' Association, Osgoode Hall Law School and the International Association of Forensic Sciences. He is a frequent legal commentator on radio and television. He is currently the Past-Chair of the John Howard Society of Hamilton, Burlington and Area.

In 1983, he developed the concept of lawyers performing "Twelve Angry Men" on stage, an idea which has led to "lawyers' shows" being produced as fund-raising activities for theatre companies and charitable causes across North America. Among the shows he has performed in with the Hamilton Lawyers' Club at Theatre Aquarius include "A Few Good Men", "A Man For All Seasons" and "Witness for the Prosecution".

We are pleased that you are using this service and happy to report that this valued service has been completely signed up for 2024. If you can, please take a moment and thank our valued sponsors for their strong support!


