This has been a relatively quiet month for our club, so I will share our organization's history with you. The Probus Club movement was formed in the United Kingdom in 1965. It began in two clubs, both created by members of Rotary.

It is widely acknowledged that Probus was founded in Welwyn Garden City 59 years ago. It has now spread to many countries worldwide and has been described by an Australian member as the best thing England has ever exported!

The late John Reynolds Morris, a past Governor of Rotary District 709 encompassing south-central Ontario and a large portion of New York State, was introduced to the Probus concept in 1981 on a honeymoon trip to Australia and New Zealand. He brought the idea back to Canada and was the founding member of the Probus organization in Canada. John engaged Rotary clubs to sponsor the introduction of Probus clubs, and the first club was formed in Cambridge, ON, on March 17, 1987. The second club was formed in White Rock/South Surrey, B.C., in September of the same year. Canada now has 230 clubs with 35,000 members nationwide.

John Morris was also the former owner/president of Burlington-based Utter/ Morris Insurance Brokers Limited, with whom I had many business dealings.


